Art en Fleurs 2024 - Cooler by the Lake:

The Art en Fleurs 2024 - "Cooler by the Lake" GCA Major Flower Show was coordinated and managed by four Kettle Moraine Garden Club co-leaders (Susan Blott, Jan Ewald, Maureen Hill and Kari Pietsch-Wangard) working together to create the final event. The show was held over two days in the beautiful setting of Saint John's On The Lake senior living community in Milwaukee overlooking Lake Michigan. A two year planning commitment was required with each Wisconsin garden club (Green Tree, Kettle Moraine, Lake Geneva, and Town and Country) playing a critical role in its success. One of the stand-out features was the collaboration and enthusiasm brought forward, shared and implemented; truly an incredible but rewarding achievement appreciated by all.

The show featured divisions in Floral Design, Horticulture, Photography, and Botanical Arts as well as Educational Exhibits in Conservation and Garden History and Design. Two non-GCA Specialty Classes of Needle Arts and Botanical Illustration were introduced as well. Finally, three guest speakers presented topics related to our water-theme: Melinda Myers (Gardening Expert) on Adding Native Plants to Your Landscape to Help Protect our Water, Jennifer Bolger Beceda (Milwaukee Riverkeeper) on Helping Milwaukee Thrive by Truly Becoming a Healthy Centric Community, and Rebecca D. Klaper (UWM School of Freshwater Sciences) on Our Important Freshwater Resources: Threats from Contaminants, Invasive Species and Overuse.

Monday, September 9th, was a flurry of activity as exhibitors brought in Horticulture potted plants and cut specimens. Volunteer Passers and Stagers worked diligently to ensure entries met requirements and were properly set up. In addition, Floral Design arrangements were created and Educational exhibits were assembled. Judges from across the country were welcomed to Milwaukee and treated to a delectable dinner at the historic Milwaukee Club.

On Tuesday, September 10th, more Horticulture cut specimens were brought in and additional Floral Design entries were created. After a delicious breakfast provided by the Saint John's On The Lake staff, the Judges began their difficult task of determining winners. That afternoon, the show opened to the residents of Saint John's and an

eager public. A steady crowd of appreciative viewers roamed through the halls of Saint John's until the show closed that evening to prepare for the celebration party, "Seas the Night". GCA members and guests as well as judges enjoyed catered heavy appetizers, and the GCA Major Flower Show Awards and Sponsoring Club Awards were presented.
